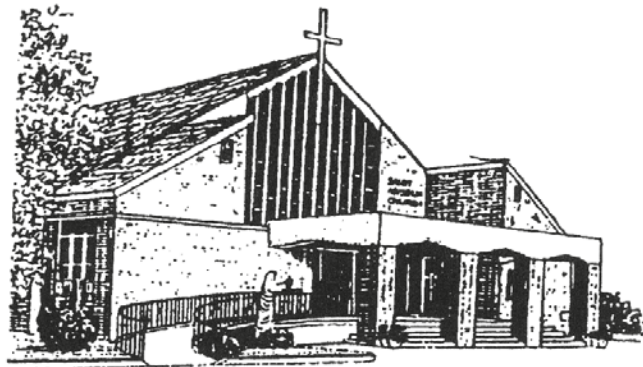

A Blessed Second Sunday of Advent to you:

It is difficult to believe; however, this Sunday we are lighting the second purple candle of our Advent Wreath. A brief history and explanation of the Advent Wreath: Traditionally, Advent wreaths are constructed of a circle of evergreen branches into which four candles are inserted, representing the four weeks of Advent. Ideally, three candles are purple and one is rose, but white candles can also be used.

The purple candles in particular symbolize the prayer, penance, and preparatory sacrifices and good works undertaken at this time. The rose candle is lit on the third Sunday, Gaudete Sunday, when the priest also wears rose vestments at Mass. Gaudete Sunday is the Sunday of rejoicing because the faithful have arrived at the midpoint of Advent when their preparation is now half over and they are close to Christmas.

The progressive lighting of the candles symbolizes the expectation and hope surrounding our Lord's first coming into the world and the anticipation of his second coming to judge the living and the dead.

A few things to catch-up on...This is a follow-up to the Thanksgiving Mass celebrated on the Tuesday evening before Thanksgiving. After Mass, we filled up Fr. Murphy's truck with canned food goods collected at St. Anselm School, CCD, and by the Boy Scouts. Father's truck was filled to the top. However, so much more food awaited him on his return trip to our parish. In an e-mail, he said that the food that was collected more than filled their like that of our students and parishioners. We had many cans of food left over and boxed that we are now able to replenish our own food cupboard as well as helping out the nearby Holy Redeemer food outsource. And, in addition, our St. Vincent de Paul Society has other destinations for the food that was collected. Once again, St. Anselm Parish proves herself to be awesome in whatever cause or purpose that we set our minds, talents, and resources to. Well Done, Anselm's!!

A few weeks ago, I was asked by the Nazareth Academy High School community to be the main celebrant for their Junior Ring Mass. It was a wonderful experience for me. I was invited joyfully into the school that night and was able to experience the zeal and zest of the Nazareth Academy school community. The entire evening was very reverent, prayerful, and not many schools sing their "school song" with as much enthusiasm as was on display in the chapel that evening. I also had an opportunity to meet many of the parents and grandparents of the students over the next couple of days. As with most of them, there was either a St. Anselm, St. Bernard, or a Father Judge connection.

Once again, our annual "19154 5K" race is taking shape. Year round, our race committee contributes long hours and efforts and talents into making the race a success every year. Please consult the website for information concerning participating and volunteering: 191545K.com

Another reminder to please take a "Little Blue Book" with you for the Advent Season. Last year there were many books left over. Let's make sure we are taking advantage of this enhancement to our Advent preparations.

Enough for now. I hope that you are preparing spiritually to receive the New Born King on Christmas Morning. Two candles have been lit; only two more to go...

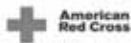
