

A Second Sunday of Lent greeting to you:

God bless you all.

On March 1, we obviously began our Lenten Season with Ash Wednesday. Our St. Anselm Church was very busy from the 6:30 AM Mass in the morning until our closing Mass at 7:00 PM. Many of our faithful passed through the doors of our church to receive the sacred sign of their Lenten duties and promises. Our school children received their ashes during a special service at 1:00 in the afternoon. Because of the homily that I was to give at the service, I let my hair grow a little longer than it normally is. I also did not shave for four days. The reason was that I wanted to focus on the words of the gospel on Ash Wednesday, "... when you are fasting, comb your hair and groom your face..." I processed into the service with my hair messed-up and with no shave. (Afterward, I found out that several parents and teachers were asking one another if I was $OK \odot$). With the help of Mrs. Graham's first grade class, they questioned me about the words of the gospel, and my appearance. The highlight of my night was to announce the horses before the race. I also enjoy going from table to table to chat with all those in attendance. Like the 19154 5K, there is so much preparation that goes into the planning of such an evening. The preparation, like so many activities for the support of our school, is always done with love and care. Thank you to our sponsors, our contributors, and to all of our supporters.

As you saw and heard last week, the Lenten Crosses have returned. If you have not picked one up yet, please do so today. Also, we have some extra copies of our Lenten Black Book for meditations. Preceding the concert, our Ladies of St. Anselm will have a pasta dinner in the church hall. It is our way of providing a dinner theatre atmosphere to our concert event. As I experienced last year, it is truly a wonderful evening.

May God continue to bless you and your family. May our good Lord give you the courage, patience, and strength to make this Lenten Season an enriching and holy one for you. God bless you.
