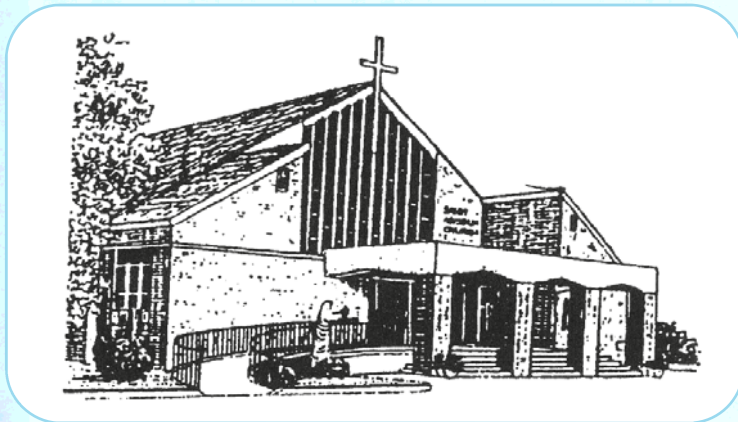

Happy Fifth Week of Easter Time:

Our Easter Season is moving along very quickly. Temperatures have moderated just a bit. Compared to 32 degrees and below, anything above 40 degrees is a plus...These past two weekends we have seen how Jesus is compared to the Good Shepherd, and we are all parts of the vine that has Jesus as our root. Trusting and growing in Our Lord should be our goal each and every day. Sometimes this can be very easy and, as we know, when life throws many different things at us, it can also be very difficult. Continue to trust in our Risen Lord always, especially during this Easter Time. Trusting in Him will lead to the ability to grow in faith, hope, and love.

A few things to catch-up on...This past Friday, I had my weekly opportunity to be in the classroom with our awesome 8th Grade. This year, their textbook has placed an emphasis on Catholic Church history. We have covered a wide range of topics through the ages of the Church. When we covered “the Popes and the Papacy,” I told the students that we should have a “conclave” and “elect” a new pope. And so, we did. I set up the voting procedure to resemble the NCAA Basketball Tournament. We had 4 brackets: North America, South/Central/Latin America, Europe/Asia, and Africa/Oceania. The students went to GCatholic.org and researched the eligible Cardinals. We started with the “Sweet Sistine,” with each student telling the class why they chose a particular Cardinal (age, location, positions held within the Church...). The students voted and narrowed the field to the “Enlightened Eight,” then to the “Faithful Four,” and, finally, to the “Truthful Two.” Once again, the students who nominated the two remaining Cardinals gave a brief presentation on their candidate. And then, the final ballots were cast, in secret. When the votes were tabulated, our 8th Grade students elected Cardinal Mario Poli from South America to be our new pope. Accordingly, we put the ballots in the thurible and safely burned them with the addition of a few grains of incense which gave off the white smoke indicative of a newly elected pope. The student who nominated the winner had the chance to proclaim: “Habemus Papem! (We have a Pope!). Well done, 8th Grade!

Thank you to our First Grade, our “Graham Crackers,” for their wonderful art project making jelly-fish. As I walked by their classroom, two weeks ago, they were proudly showing me their works of art. I told them how nice the fish looked and, low and behold, this week they made a jelly fish for me! It is currently on display on the front door of the Parish Center. Thank you, thank you!

Finally, a thank you to our Saint Vincent DePaul Society for their excellent work on this Spring’s Clothing Drive. The truck pulled into our parking lot around 9 o’clock in the morning. By 10 o’clock, business was brisk around the truck. The final tally was one very full truck loaded with clothing and accessories to help those who are less fortunate. Yet another sign of how caring our parishioners of Saint Anselm are. In fact, it was not a coincidence that the date of the Clothing Drive took place on the feast day of Saint Anselm, April 21. All things make sense in a world that revolves around Our good Lord.

Enough for now... Remember to trust in Our Lord, our Good Shepherd. Also, by trusting in Him, we can share His life and blessings while we cling to Him on the Vine of Life. God bless you.
