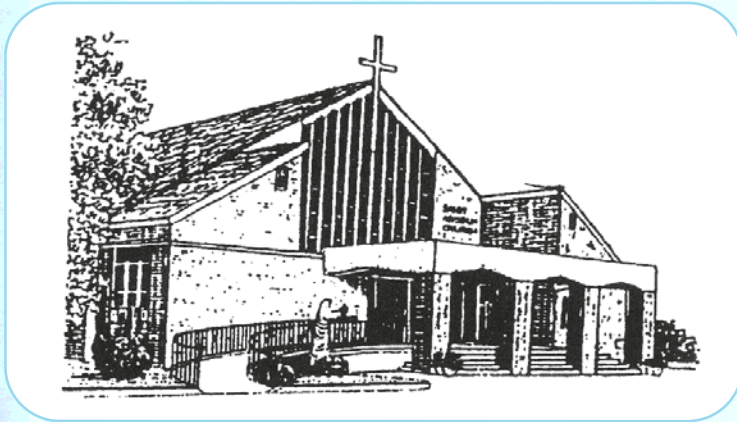

**An early June greeting to you:**

**The month of June has always been a time for us to reflect on the Sacred Heart of Jesus. Through His heart, many graces flow down upon us for help, mercy, and love. A brief history of this testament of our faith:**

**Since the 16th century Catholic piety has assigned entire months to special devotions. The month of June is set apart for devotion to the Sacred Heart of Jesus. "From among all the proofs of the infinite goodness of our Savior none stands out more prominently than the fact that, as the love of the faithful grew cold, He, Divine Love Itself, gave Himself to us to be honored by a very special devotion and that the rich treasury of the Church was thrown wide open in the interests of that devotion." These words of Pope Pius XI refer to the Sacred Heart Devotion, which, in its present form, dates from the revelations given to Saint Margaret Mary Alacoque in 1673-75. The devotion consists in the divine worship of the human heart of Christ, which is united to His divinity and which is a symbol of His love for us. The aim of the devotion is to make our Lord king over our hearts by prompting them to return love to Him (especially through an act of consecration by which we offer to the Heart of Jesus both ourselves and all that belongs to us) and to make reparation for our ingratitude to God.**

**Once again, a thank you for all who contributed, in any way, to our carnival. As always, our carnival serves a two-fold purpose. First, it helps to keep our school tuition and costs in a reasonable range. The profits of our carnival serve as a reminder of how important our St. Anselm School is to our local community. Secondly, our carnival serves as a reminder and a symbol of all of the fundraisers that we have all year at St. Anselm Parish. Namely, how our entire parish community comes together for the benefit of all. The young in age and the young at heart gather in a spirit of cooperation and dedication to all of the values that our parish stands for. The interactions between all of the various facets of our St. Anselm Parish community always come together in a beautiful and positive way. Please read more about our carnival further back in our bulletin.**

**On Wednesday evening, May 24, we assembled in our church, for the celebration of the vigil for the feast of The Ascension. The main celebrant that evening was Fr. Keith Chylinski. Following Mass, the congregation processed from church to our Prayer Garden. As our parishioners moved toward the Prayer Garden, the rosary was being recited. Once in the garden, the focus shifted to the new memorial stone that we now have in the garden. This stone was donated to our St. Anselm Parish by The Knights of Columbus, Regina Coeli Council. The foundation was dug and poured by Tom Rowan of Academy Concrete. As many of our parishioners know, it was the goal of Fr. Chylinski to someday have this monument as part of our Prayer Garden. As Father was blessing and dedicating the memorial to the unborn, a jet took off from the airport. It was almost like a "fly-over" to accentuate the blessing of the stone. Fr. Chylinski asked if I had anything to do with that. I said no; but, maybe the Lord did...A thank you to all who helped to plan and arrange all of the logistics that went into the evening: Mrs. Leonetti, Mrs. Zaremski, Mary Ann Thackrah, our Evangelization Committee, and the Knights of Columbus.**

**On a more somber note, our parish school was the scene of vandalism on Sunday evening of Memorial Day weekend. The glass panel of the "A" door was smashed. The police of our 8<sup>th</sup> District responded immediately and were on our premises within minutes. We thank them for their quick response. An incident report was completed and filed. I cleaned up the area that night, both inside and outside of the doorway. Mr. McGuckin came in and boarded up the damaged area. Mr. Jackson assisted by removing the source of the destruction-a steel bucket-that was thrown on the top of the over-hang of "A" door. Summer is just starting. An extra set of eyes is always needed for our property. I am doing my best to try and take care of our property. Please, if you see anything out of the ordinary on our parish premises, let us know.**

**May the Sacred Heart of Jesus be praised, loved, adored, and glorified forever. Amen.**

### AID FOR FRIENDS

As the need for assistance becomes greater, and the summer months approach, we encourage you to continue to provide meals and we would welcome new participation. If you are able to make extra when preparing your dinners, there are containers in Room B in which to place a meal and provide dinner for someone in need.

### PROPERTY TAX REBATE

To help with the rising cost of living, you are reminded that Pennsylvania Property Tax/Rent Rebate Program applications are available. There are new guidelines which will permit individuals who qualify to receive a rebate between \$250 and \$650 from property taxes or rent paid last year. Funding for this rebate program is made possible from the Pennsylvania State Lottery Fund and is a rebate that does not have to be repaid. This application must be filed by June 30, 2017.

To qualify, you must be 65 years of age or older, a widow or widower 50 years of age or older, or a disabled person 18 years or older. Homeowners that have an annual income of \$36,663 or less and renters with annual incomes of \$15,713 or less could qualify. Only half of your annual Society Security or SSI income is counted toward the income guideline. For more information or an application, call United Social Services, Monday through Friday between 10 AM and 4 PM at 215-923-1900. All inquiries are confidential and services are provided free of charge.
