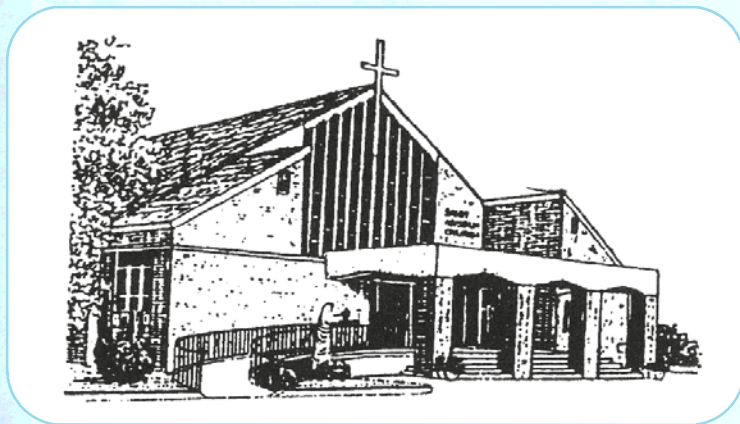

A Happy Fourth of July Greeting to you:

This upcoming week marks our 4th of July celebrations. We are reminded of the freedoms that we are blessed with in our country. I think that I told you last year that it was our family tradition, on the 4th of July, to have our picnic at Washington's Crossing. We would pack up everything, including the very heavy red "Coca-Cola Cooler." We knew it was a special time when the cooler came out of the garage... And, as we gather in many different places this weekend, with our own holiday traditions, let us remember those who were and are responsible for our freedom. Our flag, a symbol of the people and country that it represents, should always be pledged to as "one nation, under God." I remember when I first came to the parish. One of the first things that I noticed was that there was no American Flag in our sanctuary. That changed very quickly. After reinstalling the flag in our sanctuary, I did some research on the tradition of the American Flag in our churches. It seems the tradition started during World War II. The flag was to be a remembrance of those who were fighting for our country and a support to their families here at home. As you look at the flag in church this week, may it serve as a reminder to our generation to salute all who continue to fight to make our country free.

Our magnificent American flag has three central and vivid colors:

The RED stripes on our flag symbolize the hardiness and valor of the American people who are always willing to sacrifice for others.

The WHITE stripes on our flag symbolize the purity and innocence of a people who recognized that tyranny would not be part of their "new" country.

The BLUE field of stars on our flag symbolizes the vigilance, perseverance, and justice of a country that still strives to make herself better.

We can also apply these three special colors to our Church and our beliefs:

The color RED is always a symbol to Catholics of the precious Body and Blood of Christ that we celebrate in the Eucharist. Also, that Our Lord sacrificed His life for our salvation.

The color WHITE shows how all of us, no matter our age, are children of God. It is our effort, on a daily basis, to resist temptation and to walk always toward God our Father.

The color BLUE, most certainly, belongs to Our Blessed Mother. No other faith in the world has Our Lady as a Model and Intercessor. With a mother's love, she continues to watch over her children, as she watched over the Child Jesus.

Be safe and may God bless you as you enjoy your holiday weekend and days.

IMPORTANT INFORMATION ON PROTECTING CHILDREN AND FAMILIES

Over the past 15 years, the Archdiocese of Philadelphia (AOP) has put into practice a wide range of reforms to protect young people. In fulfilling our duty to protect children, our efforts are comprehensive:

- All people working with children, including volunteers, undergo criminal background checks and child-abuse clearances.
- All AOP clergy, staff and volunteers who have regular contact with children complete Safe Environment training programs and Mandatory Reporter training programs. More than 110,000 adults have received training to recognize, respond to, and report abuse since 2003.
- All young people in grades K-12 receive age-appropriate abuse-prevention education.
- All employees and volunteers who have contact with children are required to report suspicions of child abuse.
- AOP Office of Child and Youth Protection staffers develop policies and training programs based on the law, best practices and the AOP's "Standards of Ministerial Behavior and Boundaries" to clearly define acceptable and unacceptable conduct. These policies apply to all Archdiocesan clergy, staff, volunteers, parents, and members of parish communities.
- An active "Safe Environment program" is mandated within all of our parishes, schools, and youth programs for compliance audits and disseminating information and resources on child abuse prevention. There are 280 designated "Safe Environment Coordinators" diocese-wide serving parishes, schools and youth ministries.
- We encourage the general public to report *all* suspected child abuse by clergy or anyone associated with an AOP program to the Commonwealth's statewide Childline system (800.932.0313, toll free), to local police, and to the AOP Office of Investigations (888.930.9010, toll free).
- We require that our Office of Investigations (led by a former Philadelphia First Assistant District Attorney) handle allegations of misconduct and that every allegation involving minors be reported to law enforcement, logged, and reviewed to determine whether interim restrictions on ministry or employment are required.
- We refer all allegations against clergy members involving minors -- even those not related to abuse but solely involving violations of the AOP's "Standards of Ministerial Behavior and Boundaries" -- to the Archdiocesan Review Board (comprised of medical, former law enforcement, and other professionals in the field of addressing child abuse), which functions as an independent consultative body to the Archbishop.
- We submit to regular audits and the USCCB's annual report process, which allows independent auditors to evaluate the Archdiocese's youth protection efforts and response.

In addition to our efforts at abuse prevention, the Archdiocese also provides significant support for survivors of abuse and their families. This program encourages victims to come forward, no matter when the abuse may have occurred, and provides for independent counseling and other services. The Archdiocese has a permanent commitment to help abuse survivors heal.
