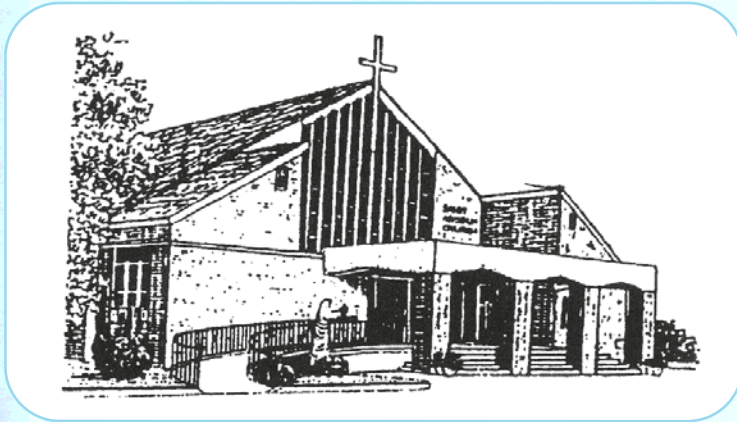

Another Warm July Greeting to all:

It seems like the days and weeks go by so quickly; and yet, when we are stuck in the middle of another heat wave, the minutes turn into hours. Somewhere, in the middle of winter, we look forward to a day or two of warmth; but, not now. Try to stay cool under the divine breezes of Our Lord's comfort.

VANDALISM AT SAINT ANSELM PARISH!!

As you may recall, last Saturday night and Sunday, I spoke at each of our Masses concerning the vandalism that has occurred on our St. Anselm property, since Memorial Day weekend. There have been four such incidents:

1. On Sunday, May 28th, around 7:00 PM, a group of young individuals thought it proper to smash the windows of our school "A" door. The damage was significant and un-nerving. I cleaned up the broken glass that was covering the inside of the school entrance. Less than 36 hours later, our younger school students would be entering through that door. With the help of Mr. McGuckin and Mr. Jackson, everything was placed in order for school to resume on Tuesday morning. The glass was replaced expeditiously by the "glass man." The 8th Police District was summoned by me on the evening of the event. They were there very quickly and filed an incident report.
2. On Saturday evening, June 3, behind our Annex building, that we rent to the City of Philadelphia for their SPIN program, a group of young folks saw it fitting to throw and scatter the food receptacles and containers left outside for the daily food deliveries. Once again, our 8th District responded immediately to disperse the crowd. The damage was not visible until the morning. Once discovered, the folks who use our gym on Sunday morning graciously cleaned up the mess and tried to return things to their proper order. Not being sure of the possible return of the young folks, I myself secured the trays and items in our Gym entry way and put all items out for the Monday morning delivery at 4:00 AM!
3. Some time during the night of Saturday, June 10th, glass bottles were broken and strewn throughout our parking lot. This was discovered by the early arriving parishioners for the 8:00 Mass on Sunday. With their help, along with our weekend sacristan, the lot was cleared of the broken debris. Certainly, not the type of preparation for Sunday Mass that one would expect coming to church. No police report was filed.
4. On the evening of Tuesday, July 11th, at 9:30 PM, St. Anselm Church property was once again targeted for vandalism. This time, a group of about 10 – 15 YOUNG individuals tried to break into our parish garage. Using the very heavy and awkward stone vases that we use for "ash trays" around the exterior of the church, they picked one up and threw it against the service door leading into the garage. Having broken the vase, and the door knob and lock, they were then attempting to open the door-FOR WHO KNOWS WHAT! Upon hearing the noise, I went out and scattered the crowd. Once again, the police were called; they came and filed yet ANOTHER REPORT.

As I have said, I cannot fight this battle alone. Once I spoke from the altar, actually for the first time on Wednesday, July 12th, our parishioners mobilized. Within 24 hours, I heard from our elected government officials, including a personal call from State Representative White and direct contacts from the offices of State Senator Sabatini and our City Councilman, Brian O'Neill.

With these incidents in mind, we are being pro-active in our efforts to combat future problems. Last week, we installed enclosed fixtures for our back entrances to the church hall. Many a night, I have found all kinds of people hiding in the stairwells. Believe me, the parish looks a lot different at 2:00 in the morning, especially when I'm by myself!

We are also installing a series of cameras throughout the property. Our installer, who has worked in our school building before, showed me the effectiveness of the cameras. Some will be visible; some, not. The police suggested such deterrents, especially in their efforts to help us. With a 90 day recording bank, we will be able to not only show the police who is causing the damage but, also, include the 8th District, via an App, to our recordings.

To this end, in the past week or so, very generous parishioners of St. Anselm have come forward with donations that will cover most of the above improvements and deterrents. I am extremely humbled by and grateful for this.

We all need to work together to be as pro-active and vigilant as we can. Also, I have noticed that some of our folks are taking a drive through our parking lot, during the peak hours of 8 – 10 PM. I thank you. Also, some of our folks who walk their pets are appearing. A quick note: an attempted church break-in was thwarted by an alert “walker and parishioner” last winter. We are most grateful for any extra eyes and ears and legs (even 4) that we can have watching over our property.
