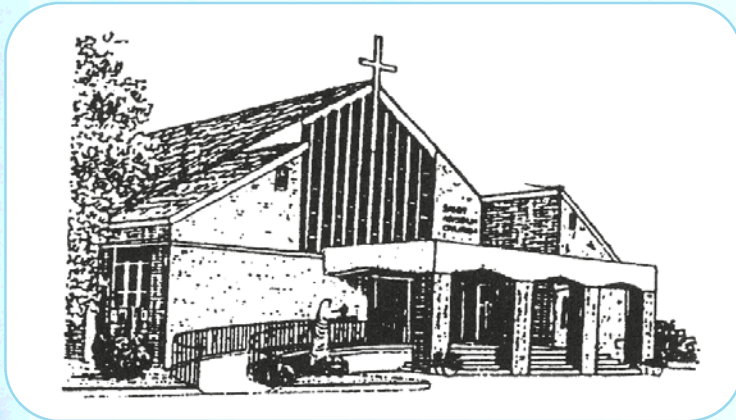

An August greeting to all:

August, in the sense of the month; and august, in the sense of a warm, hearty greeting. Where has the summer gone? Certainly the temperatures of the summer have lived up to their reputation. Once again, hopefully you have had time to enjoy a bit of rest and relaxation these past couple of weeks. We are all looking forward to everyone returning from their vacations and beginning school once again. Looking forward, also, to our St. Anselm Church being more populated on the weekends. Always a good, august sign.

Some feast days coming up this week...

Monday, August 21, the feast of St. Pius X: He was born on June 2, 1835, in the city of Venice, Italy. His father worked for the Italian Post Office. As far as St. Pius' theology and zeal, he never "mailed it in." His church reforms included frequent communion for both children and adults. Today, we take receiving communion at all Masses for granted; but, not in the time of Pius' life. It was through his efforts that we can receive Holy Communion at 7 years of age. I hope I can convey this story in a way that makes sense. When I was teaching high school, we had televisions in each class room. During the Homeroom Period, the televisions were tuned in to Channel One, a national service that presented timely news, etc. to our younger generation students. Periodically, one of the receiving schools sent a tee-shirt or a hat to the Channel One celebrities, for them to show or wear on the broadcast. One day, students from St. Pius X High School sent a shirt to Channel One and the person on the news said: "I want to thank the students of St. Pius the X (pronounced ECKS) for the tee-shirt. Really...? Didn't the person on Channel One ever learn or hear about Roman Numerals? Anyway, St. Pius X died on August 20, 1914. He is the patron saint of First Communicants and sick pilgrims. Not sure if this included those on the Mayflower...

Tuesday, August 22, the feast of the Queenship of Mary. The title of "Queen" is bestowed upon Our Blessed Mother by virtue of her close relationship with Jesus, her son and the Son of God. Also, as Jesus is known as the King of Kings and Lord of Lords and under the title of Christ the King, it was through Mary, at the Annunciation, that her title of Queen works quite easily. In our own area, we have the title of one of our parishes in Levittown dedicated to the "Queen of the Universe." In the surrounding Philadelphia counties, we have Mary, as the Queen of Peace, in Ardsley, Montgomery County. One of my priest friends was stationed there and, one night, the phone rang late at night. It was a call from a tele-marketer. The person asked if they could speak to the "Queen of Peace?" My friend replied: "I'm sorry; the Queen is not in right now..." There is a long and theological path for Mary's Queenship throughout our church history.

Wednesday, August 23, the feast of St. Rose of Lima: Her actual birth name is Isabel Flores de Olivia. She was born in Peru and was nick-named "Rosa" because of her beauty. She was a member of the Tertiary Dominican Order and lived a life of penance and solitude. She also cared for the homeless, elderly, and sick. She was the first saint canonized in "the New World." She is the patroness of the Philippines and of South America, especially, Peru. She is also the patron saint of florists and gardeners. St. Rose of Lima died at the age of 31.

Enough for now... May I thank all of our wonderful parishioners for their donations and concern in view of the recent vandalism on our church and school properties. Thank you, also, to all of you who are taking an extra walk around our premises on a nightly basis. Whether alone, with family or friends, or with four-legged companions, your presence is making a difference. Thanks to all of those who are taking a ride around the grounds at night. I see you and I am very grateful to all of you for your help and concern. God bless you.

Back to School News



The school office is open daily from 9 AM to 2 PM.

Parents wishing to register or transfer students may come to the school office to do so. For more information regarding registration, please call the school office at 215-632-1133. Some grades do have a waiting list.

School reopens for students in Grades 1 to 8 on Wednesday, September 6.

Students in Grades 1 to 8 should report to school at 7:45 AM. Students only are to enter the school doors on Dunks Ferry Road and report to their new grades. Teachers will meet the students and escort them into their new classrooms. Dismissal for students in Grades 1 to 8 is 12 Noon.

Students in Kindergarten are to report to school on Thursday, September 7, at 9:30 AM.

Kindergarten students should enter the school through Door A in the back of the building. Kindergarten teachers will meet the students in the schoolyard at Door A. Dismissal for Kindergarten students only will be at 11 AM on Thursday. School hours for Grades 1 to 8 on Thursday are 7:55 AM to 12 Noon.

Students in Prekindergarten 4 are to report to school on Friday, September 8, at 9:00 AM.

Prekindergarten 4 students should enter the school through Door A in the back of the building. The Prekindergarten 4 teacher will meet the students in the PK4 classroom. Dismissal for Prekindergarten 4 students only will be 10:30 AM on Friday. PK4 students will be dismissed from Door A in the schoolyard. School hours for Grades Kindergarten to 8 on Friday are 7:55 AM to 12 Noon.

Students in Prekindergarten 3 are to report to school on Friday, September 8, at 9:30 AM.

Prekindergarten 3 students should enter the school through Door A in the back of the building. The Prekindergarten 3 teacher will meet the students in the PK3 classroom. Dismissal for Prekindergarten 3 students only will be 11:00 AM on Friday. PK3 students will be dismissed from Door A in the schoolyard. School hours for Grades Kindergarten to 8 on Friday are 7:55 AM to 12 Noon.

Beginning Monday, September 11, school hours for all students (PK3-8) are 7:55 AM to 2:50 PM.

Students in Grades PK3 to 8 are to be in full uniform beginning on the first day of school. Kindergarten and Prekindergarten 3 and 4 students wear their Physical Education uniforms everyday. Students should bring a healthy snack to school each day. Pretzels will be sold beginning Monday, September 18.

School uniforms and physical education uniforms (PK3-8) are to be purchased from Flynn & O'Hara Uniforms on Dutton Road (215-637-4600). If you plan to have your male child wear the white golf shirt, only white golf shirts with the Saint Anselm School logo are acceptable. No substitutions are permitted.

Parents of students in PK3, PK4, K, and Grade 1 will receive letters with more information about the opening of school in the mail. Please watch for this mailing around the third week of August. If you do not receive your letter, please call school immediately so we may help you.

We look forward to a new academic year that will be both spiritually and academically enriching for your child. We know we can count on the support and cooperation of our parents as we minister together to help parents in their awesome responsibility of educating their children. Enjoy the remaining days of summer.
