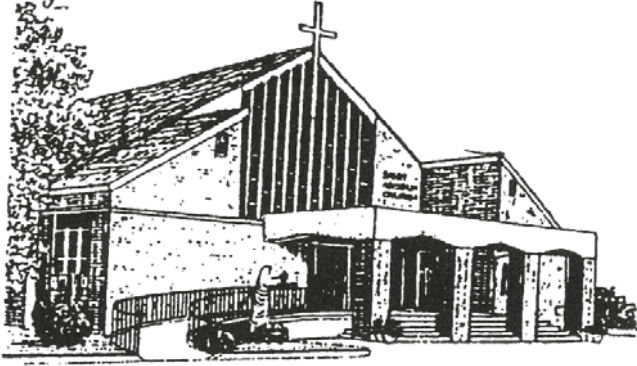

A Happy September Greeting to You!

Here we are, school is back in session and the summer vacation time is over. Just where did the time go? I keep mentioning in this bulletin about the heat of the summer months. And now I am also talking about September being a hot month also. It is a good thing that we are offering water ice this weekend. Who knew how time sensitive this marvelous little occasion would be?

September brings many exciting things to our parish. This past week, we welcomed our 1st through 8th graders on Wednesday morning. On Thursday morning, we welcomed our new Kindergarten Class. And, on Friday morning, we welcomed our Pre-Kindergarten Class to St. Anselm School. A truly wonderful time; although, there were a few tears shed by students and parents alike. Our school begins its year with a smaller enrollment than last year. However, we continue to ask you to talk up our 3 Year Old Program for next year. Registration for the 3 year Old Program will take place before Christmas. Please tell your friends and relatives. As with many procedures in this neck of the woods, being a St. Anselm Parish member or family is not required. Remember, here at St. Anselm school, we are more concerned with quality, not necessarily, quantity.

Two important events have taken place in our Universal Catholic Church these past two weeks. On September 1, Pope Francis called on all Christians to observe what would be the 8th Corporal and Spiritual Work of Mercy. These works deal with the effects of climate change on our planet. In this Jubilee Year of Mercy, our Holy Father asks us to be conscious of the world around us. As the Pope points out, "As a spiritual work of mercy, care for our common home calls for a 'grateful contemplation of the world that God created' which allows us to discover in each thing a teaching which God wishes to hand on to us." "As a corporal work of mercy, care for our common home requires 'simple daily gestures which break with the logic of violence, exploitation and selfishness' and 'makes itself felt in every action that seeks to build a better world'." Also, this past week marked the canonization of St. Teresa of Calcutta, formerly, Mother Teresa. A beautiful honor to a beautiful woman. Her work exemplifies every corporal and spiritual work of mercy A very brief synopsis of the life of the new Saint Teresa: "a consecrated missionary who had been teaching geography in a High School in Calcutta heard her vocational calling. Though already a member of the Sisters of Loretto, Sister Teresa had received an unmistakable request from the Lord: live and work among the poorest of the poor. Despite not knowing where or how she would accomplish His order, she obeyed. Four years later, she had her answer. The little nun found herself back in Calcutta, but this time in its slums, not schools.

With several of her former students at her side, she set out to minister to its people, from making house calls to sick residents to gathering those abandoned and suffering in the streets. It wasn't long before her efforts of seeking Christ in those that the world had forgotten had finally attracted the world's attention. As her mission progressed in an age of material wealth and industrialism, Mother Teresa and her Missionaries of Charity would go on to open up the eyes of the world to the importance of living simply, loving greatly, and the looming threat of spiritual poverty.

We are very aware that today is the 15th anniversary of the September 11th attacks on our country. Those who are old enough remember where they were on that fateful day in 2001. I was teaching at Bishop McDevitt High School, end of 1st Period, in Room 3. Little did we know that morning when school or work started that our world would change forever that day. A prayer today for all the lives that were lost that day. A prayer for all of our police, firefighters, first responders, and our military troops for guarding and protecting our communities and our home land every day. We are most grateful for your service.

May God continue to bless you and your families as we embark on another school year.
