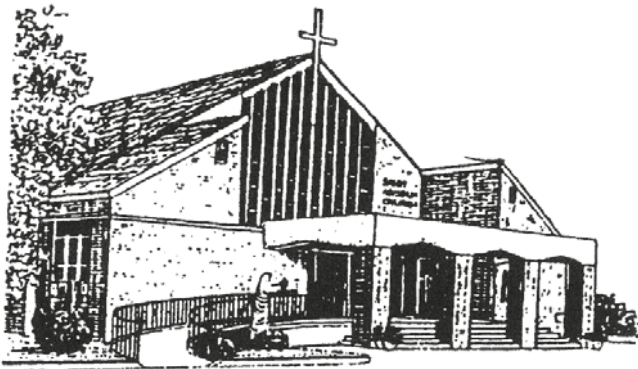

A Labor Day Weekend greeting to all:

There was a song in the 1960's, sung by a few groups, with the title: "See You in September." I remember that I used to nag my students in June by singing this song to them. "Father," they would say, "Don't say the word September..." And yet, here we are. As was mentioned many times during the summer and, as you have experienced in your own life, it sure has been a hot one. I pray that you have spent some time with the Lord during the summer months. While we always use the summer months to regenerate and refresh ourselves physically and mentally, we should also use the time in a "Lenten way" to refresh and renew ourselves spiritually.

This time of year reminds me of many things, usually pertaining to school and coaching. After a year here at St. Anselm, I have realized that precious few people knew that I coached soccer and softball for 22 years in the Philadelphia Catholic League. As the CYO sports programs begin anew at this time of year, I just thought that I would throw that out there...

For my family and I, this time of year also brought for us a trip to New York. Every year my family would go to the U.S. Tennis Open held in Flushing, New York on the Friday of Labor Day weekend. Whenever I could finagle my soccer team schedule around this day, I would join them. I have to admit that I don't mind driving my car anywhere, except in New York City. I find the streets of downtown Philadelphia to be very easy to navigate. Maybe not traffic wise, but the numbered streets and the vast "one-way" streets make it very easy for me to get around. Not so for me in New York. Whenever I would go to The Open, some other family member would have to drive; usually, my nephew Jim.

One year we were driving up the New Jersey Turnpike toward "some bridge" to lead us to New York City. All of a sudden, a massive traffic jam. (I don't think it was "Bridgegate.") Anyway, we were shuttled into this one lane and forced to go somewhere other than where my nephew had planned. Next thing, over "a bridge," and into a tunnel. When we emerged minutes later, we were in the heart of New York City at 8:00 in the morning rush hour. I had NO CLUE where we are. I looked over at my nephew. With a concerned look on his face, he surveyed the situation, and said: "Let's go this way." Sure enough, within a couple of minutes, we were on "some road" with the signs in front of us pointing to parking for the U.S. Open.

When we are "driving" with the Lord, in our everyday lives, let us remember that He knows the direction in which we should be going. At times, we can become confused and frustrated in our daily dealings with people and situations; yet, the Lord is always our chauffeur and our compass. Even though, at times, we may have NO CLUE as to how we got to a certain point, or where we are going, thankfully the Lord is in complete control of our lives. As the old Greyhound Bus commercial said: "Leave the driving to us."

May God bless you and protect you this Labor Day weekend. Get ready for all of the "awesomeness" that is about to begin in our Parish and in our School this year! Also, beware Danley Road, I may be around this week for the Parish Visitation...☺

BACK TO SCHOOL NEWS



Parents wishing to register or transfer students may come to the school office to do so. For more information regarding registration, please call the school office at 215-632-1133. Some grades do have a waiting list.

School reopens for students in Grades 1 to 8 on Wednesday, September 7.

Students in Grades 1 to 8 should report to school at 7:45 AM. Students only are to enter the school doors on Dunks Ferry Road and report to their new grades. Teachers will meet the students and escort them into their new classrooms. Dismissal for students in Grades 1 to 8 is 12 Noon.

Students in Kindergarten are to report to school on Thursday, September 8, at 9:30 AM.

Kindergarten students should enter the school through Door A in the back of the building. The Kindergarten teacher will meet the students in the schoolyard at Door A. Dismissal for Kindergarten students only will be at 11 AM on Thursday. School hours for Grades 1 to 8 on Thursday are 7:55 AM to 12 Noon.

Students in Prekindergarten are to report to school on Friday, September 9, at 9:30 AM.

Prekindergarten students should enter the school through Door A in the back of the building. The Prekindergarten teacher will meet the students in the PK classroom. Dismissal for Prekindergarten students only will be 11 AM on Friday. PK students will be dismissed from Door A in the schoolyard. School hours for Grades Kindergarten to 8 on Friday are 7:55 AM to 12 Noon.

Beginning Monday, September 12, school hours for all students (PK-8) are 7:55 AM to 2:50 PM.

Students in Grades PK to 8 are to be in full uniform beginning on the first day of school. Kindergarten and Prekindergarten students wear their Physical Education uniforms everyday. Students should bring a healthy snack to school each day. Pretzels will be sold beginning Monday, September 12.

School uniforms and physical education uniforms (PK-8) are to be purchased from Flynn & O'Hara Uniforms on Dutton Road (215-637-4600). If you plan to have your male child wear the white golf shirt, only white golf shirts with the Saint Anselm School logo are acceptable. No substitutions are permitted.

Parents of students in PK, K, and Grade 1 will receive letters with more information about the opening of school in the mail. Please watch for this mailing around the third week of August. If you do not receive your letter, please call school immediately so we may help you.

We look forward to a new academic year that will be both spiritually and academically enriching for your child. We know we can count on the support and cooperation of our parents as we minister together to help parents in their awesome responsibility of educating their children. Enjoy the remaining days of summer.
