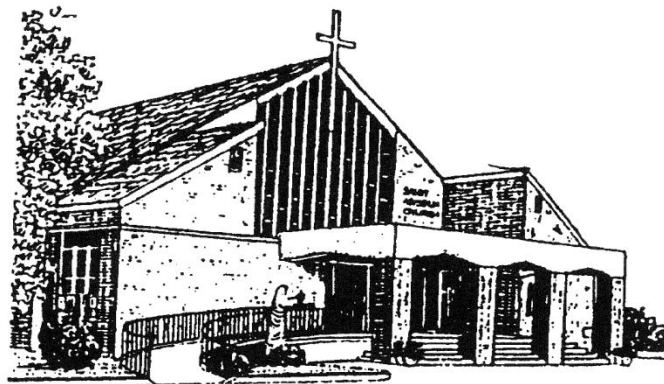

Dear Parishioners,

WELCOME Father Anthony Kizanye!

This weekend, Father Anthony Kizanye, a priest of the Diocese of Kigoma, Tanzania will be speaking at our Masses on behalf of the Missions.

The Catholic Diocese of Kigoma-Tanzania is a rural diocese in the western part of Tanzania in East Africa. One third of its 1.9 million people are Catholic. The Church in Kigoma is truly in the work of evangelization among people of different backgrounds and religious beliefs, such as Moslems and believers in the African Traditional Religion. On top of preaching the gospel to all these people, the Catholic Church involves herself fully in the provision of social services to impoverished rural communities, since left to itself, the government in Tanzania can do too little to support them.

One of the most challenging problems the Catholic Church in my diocese is facing at present is inability to sustain two centers for orphans and street children which are located in the headquarters of the diocesan see. These two centers have the total of 500 children who have been left without parents after one or both of their parents died with HIV/AIDS pandemic as well as many other tropical deceases. These children, having been left on their own by their impoverished extended families, look to the Church as their existing mother and father. At the centers we need to assure these children of three hot meals and also address their academic and health issues. Our ability to do so is highly challenged because most of our people who would have been prospective donors have the income of \$1.00 a day to fend for themselves. It is for this reason that we as the diocese go out to the ends of the earth to request the support of our sisters and brothers.

Confirmation – Rite of Election

On Sunday, September 21st during the 10:00 AM Mass, we will celebrate a Rite of Election for Confirmation with those who will be confirmed in October. Coaches, Parents, and Students are asked to schedule this on their calendars.

Bishop Joseph Martino will administer the sacrament of Confirmation in Saint Anselm Church on Thursday afternoon, October 16, 2014 at 4:00 PM.

Students in Saint Anselm School in Grade 6 and CCD Level 7 students who began their preparation for Confirmation in the spring will be confirmed.

CYO Moderators, coaches, and parents are asked to make note of the date and schedule activities around this date.

Feast of the Assumption – Friday, August 15th

Special Mass Schedule this year for the Feast of the Assumption:

7:00 PM Vigil (Thursday)

8:30 AM; 12:00 Noon and 5:00 PM

In an effort to improve the attendance at Mass on our holidays of obligation, we are trying a different Mass schedule. A 12 Noon Mass will be celebrated replacing a poorly attended Mass earlier in the day.

Because the feast of the Assumption is on Friday, please note that the Vigil Mass will be at 7:00 PM and the late Mass on Friday will be at 5:00 PM which we think will be more conducive to people's Friday schedules.

The Feast of Mary's Assumption commemorates that Mary was assumed, body and soul, into heaven at the moment of her death. Through the resurrection of Jesus, God revealed that resurrection and new life would be given to all who live their life in the spirit of Jesus. The Assumption of Mary is seen as God fulfilling that promise to Mary. The Church calls people to see, in this glorification of Mary, the assurance of their own resurrection.

R.C.I.A. What is R.C.I.A.?

The Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults (RCIA) is the process established for the universal Church for individuals to become Catholic and receive the sacraments of initiation – Baptism, Confirmation and Eucharist. This initiation process also involves a parish community experiencing a renewal in faith as it prepares and welcomes new members into the Church. The Rite speaks of conversion as a "spiritual journey." Centered on fostering a deep relationship with Jesus and the Church He founded, this journey takes place through distinct stages over a period of time suitable to bring about a thorough catechesis, significant experience of the parish community, and commitment to the liturgical and moral life of the Catholic faithful.

Who is RCIA for?

1. Persons in need of Baptism.
2. Persons baptized in another Christian tradition who desire to become Catholic.
3. Persons baptized Catholic in need of First Communion and/or Confirmation.

Saint Anselm SCRIP Program

What is SCRIP?

Participation in the SCRIP Program helps families pay tuition for Catholic education. This includes Grade Schools, High Schools and Colleges.

Gift cards are purchased in the SCRIP Office. A percentage of the purchase is credited toward the school of your choice. For those who do not have a child in Catholic School, the credit would then go to St. Anselm Parish or you may direct it to another family.

Example: Purchase food certificates
 $\$100.00 \times 52 \text{ weeks} = \$5,200.00 \times 4\% \text{ tuition reimbursement} = \208.00 per year.

Registration:

All SCRIP buyers must provide registration information. Forms are available in the SCRIP office.

Location and Summer Selling Hours:

We are located in Room "B" – enter via the school parking lot.

SCRIP Policy:

- All checks must have a telephone number and may require proof of identification
Maximum check value \$300.00
- If a check is returned for insufficient funds the purchaser is responsible for the check's value and any additional charges incurred
- Purchasers are asked to review your receipts and count your certificates before leaving
- Cash purchases require exact change
- No refunds or exchanges

Credit Distribution:

Credits of \$25.00 or more are disbursed twice a year (January and August). Credit slips must be presented when applying your credit toward a tuition payment.

BACK TO SCHOOL NEWS

Beginning August 18 the school office is open daily from 9 AM to 2 PM.

Parents wishing to register or transfer students may come to the school office to do so. For more information regarding registration, please call the school office at 215-632-1133. Some grades do have a waiting list.

School reopens for students in Grades 1 to 8 on Wednesday, September 3.

Students in Grades 1 to 8 should report to school at 7:45 AM. Students only are to enter the school doors on Dunks Ferry Road and report to their new grades. Teachers will meet the students and escort them into their new classrooms. Dismissal for students in Grades 1 to 8 is 12 Noon.

Students in Kindergarten are to report to school on Thursday, September 4, at 9:30 AM.

Kindergarten students should enter the school through Door A in the back of the building. Kindergarten teachers will meet the students in the schoolyard at Door A. Dismissal for Kindergarten students only will be at 11 AM on Thursday. Kindergarten students will be dismissed from Door A in the schoolyard. School hours for Grades 1 to 8 on Thursday are 7:55 AM to 12 Noon.

Students in Prekindergarten are to report to school on Friday, September 5, at 9:30 AM.

Prekindergarten students are to enter the school through Door A in the back of the building. The Prekindergarten teachers will meet the students at Door A. Dismissal for Prekindergarten students only will be 11 AM on Friday. PK students will be dismissed from Door A in the schoolyard. School hours for Grades Kindergarten to 8 on Friday are 7:55 AM to 12 Noon.

School hours for all students (K to 8) on Friday, September 5, are 7:55 AM to 12 Noon.

Beginning Monday, September 8, school hours for all students (PK-8) are 7:55 AM to 2:50 PM.

Students in Grades PK to 8 are to be in full uniform beginning on the first day of school. Prekindergarten and Kindergarten students wear their Physical Education uniforms everyday. Students should bring a healthy snack to school each day. Pretzels will be sold beginning Monday, September 8.

School uniforms and physical education uniforms (PK-8) are to be purchased from Flynn & O'Hara Uniforms on Dutton Road (215-637-4600). If you plan to have your child wear the white golf shirt, only white golf shirts with the Saint Anselm School logo are acceptable. No substitutions are permitted. There is a new PE Tee shirt for this year. It is not mandatory that all students wear this shirt this year. If you have PE Tee shirts from last year, those are acceptable for this year. Next year (15-16) all students must wear the new gold PE Tee shirt.

Parents of students in PK, K, and Grade 1 will receive letters with more information about the opening of school in the mail. Please watch for this mailing around the third week of August. If you do not receive your letter, please call school immediately so we may help you.
