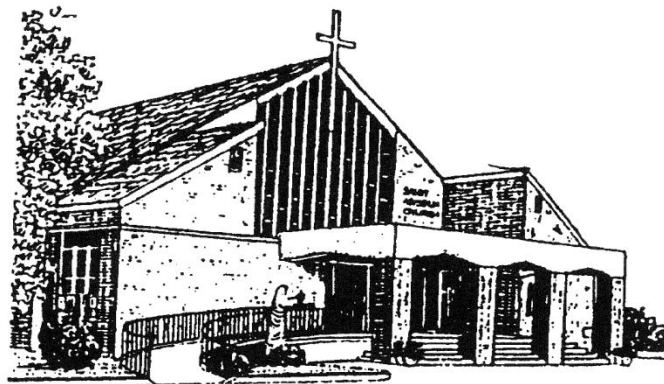

School Security & Entrance to School Building

The world in which we live has caused the implementation of many security and safety precautions. All schools, including Saint Anselm School, are concerned about the safety of students, teachers and others in the school building. All in the school need to be protected from violent and angry persons and, at times, from non-custodial parents.

All visitors to Saint Anselm School are to enter the school building via the outside door to the main office. This door is on the schoolyard side of the school and it is accessible from the parking lot behind the school.

Visitors mean everyone – parents, lunch mothers, volunteers, sales persons, and people in parish organizations who have school business.

People coming to purchase Scrip are to enter the Scrip room, which also has a door accessible from the back parking lot.

All visitors must sign in and out. In the event of a fire or fire drill, the secretary needs to take this book with her as she exits a building just as a teacher takes her roll book so the school can check that all have made it safely out of the building.

Please do not try to enter the school through the Church or the Parish Center.

Please cooperate with this. Thank you.

10 Miles per Hour in the Parking Lot

The beginning of a new school year is a good time for us to remind all drivers to drive slowly in the parking lot. During school hours and even after school hours, children are in the parking lot which is also a school yard for recreational activities.

Parking – School Hours

During school hours, please do not park in the parking lot area nearest the school. This part of the parking lot boarded by the Church and school will be used for school recess and for the after school CARES program. Also, should there be an emergency, no parking in this area will give free access to the school building for emergency response vehicles such as fire engines and ambulances.

There is plenty of parking back by the garage and fence.

Confirmation

Bishop Martino will administer the Sacrament of Confirmation on Thursday, October 16th at 4:00 PM. Students in St. Anselm School and CCD who began their preparation in the spring will be confirmed.

Those to be confirmed will celebrate the Rite of Election for Confirmation on Sunday, September 21st at 10:00 AM. CYO coaches are asked to note this date.

What is RCIA?

The Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults (RCIA) is the process established for the universal Church for individuals to become Catholic and receive the sacraments of initiation – Baptism, Confirmation and Eucharist. This initiation process also involves a parish community experiencing a renewal in faith as it prepares and welcomes new members into the Church. The Rite speaks of conversion as a "spiritual journey." Centered on fostering a deep relationship with Jesus and the Church He founded, this journey takes place through distinct stages over a period of time suitable to bring about a thorough catechesis, significant experience of the parish community, and commitment to the liturgical and moral life of the Catholic faithful.

Who is RCIA for?

1. Persons in need of Baptism.
2. Persons baptized in another Christian tradition who desire to become Catholic.
3. Persons baptized Catholic in need of First Communion and/or Confirmation.

Summer Maintenance

Cleaning of the School/Gym/Church Hall

The annual “spring” cleaning of the school, gym, and church hall during the summer has been completed. All is ready and looks very nice for a new year for our School, CCD, and Parish activities.

Food Cupboard Closet Renovated

The Saint Vincent de Paul Food Closet named *Loaves and Fishes* in memory of Ed Goshow (a former member of the Saint Vincent de Paul who maintained the Cupboard until his death) was renovated.

I am most grateful to Jack Tolchin, Jack Finnegan, and Vince Hollister for volunteering to help Jerry McGuckin with the demolition and removal of the old wooden shelves and the installation of a new ceiling with fluorescent lighting.

The Food Pantry Closet was painted, and new shelving was installed.

New School Classroom Windows

Windows in four more classrooms have been replaced. The new thermal aluminum windows with tinted, tempered glass and screens have been placed in Classrooms 18, 17, PreK A, and KB. The old windows made it difficult to keep the classrooms warm in winter. Some of the old windows were broken preventing them from being opened in nicer weather.

The cost of replacing the windows amounted to \$37,000. Monies from our reserved funds were used.

New Rose Bushes in Prayer Garden

This past winter was very hard on the rose bushes in the rosary section of our Prayer Garden. Most of them needed to be replaced.

The beautiful new rose bushes in the rosary part of the Prayer Garden have been purchased and planted in memory of Marie Stabler at the bequest of her estate. Marie was a good Catholic woman who loved Saint Anselm Church. Marie was a member of our Choir and Legion of Mary.

Thanks to Lynn O'Donnell and to all who help maintain the Rosary section of the Prayer Garden.

Gym Floor – Our Lady of Victory Hall

The Gym floor was sanded down to the bare wood. The Courts for both Basketball and Volleyball Games were lined. The center of the courts is marked with an Eagle logo – depicting our mascot. Two coats of sealer were applied as well as two coats of finish. The floor looks brand new. The cost of the work was \$9,985 of which CYO paid \$7,500 for which I am most grateful.

Tree Trimming & Removal

Two dead trees were cut down and removed. Seven trees were trimmed and elevated. Cost was \$1,900.

Spirituality Center Basement

Interior Basement walls were scrapped and wire brush to remove mold and loose materials. Repairs were made where needed. Two coats of ThoroSeal Masonry Waterproofing Coating were applied. Cost was \$6,750.

Well Done – Thank you

I wish to recognize and thank Mr. Jerry McGuckin, our Maintenance Director, who supervised, coordinated, and participated in all that has been done since June. He has also done many repairs on the lists given him by the teachers and staff. I wish to thank Mrs. Kathy Zaremski whose duties include doing the secretarial work for the Maintenance staff. She oversees the cleaning of the school. Before summer vacation began in June, faculty and students helped with the cleaning of desks and furniture.

Last but not least, I wish to thank parishioners and families of our school students who financially support Saint Anselm through Sunday collections and tuition. Your financial support has made it possible to accomplish all that has been done. Thank you.

Heritage of Faith – Vision of Hope Archdiocesan Campaign

Since 2009, parishioners from Saint Anselm Parish have been fulfilling their pledges to this Archdiocesan Campaign. This Campaign has sought to raise funds for Catholic Human Services, Clergy Retirement, St. Charles Seminary, the Cathedral, and Catholic Education.

Each parish is given 35% of the total amount given to the Campaign. Saint Anselm Parishioners have pledged \$839,009. Should all these pledges be fulfilled, Saint Anselm Parish would receive \$293,653.15 (which is 35%). As of June 2014, \$207,427.65 has been received and used.

At the time of the Campaign, we identified that the parish portion of this money would be used for: New Roof Annex School Building; Parking Lot Resurfacing, and a new Kitchen in the Church Hall.

To date, the Heritage of Faith Campaign has made it possible for the following to be done:

New Roof Annex School Building	\$ 66,450.00
Resurfacing Parking Lot (July 2010)	54,600.00
Parking Lot Repairs (April 2012)	4,700.00
Renovation Work to Kitchen in Church Hall	81,677.75
