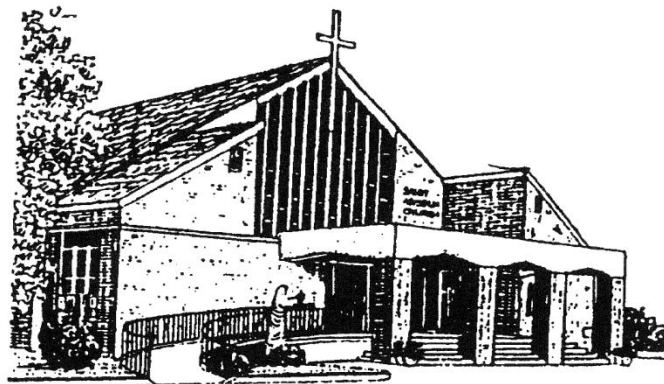

## Recognizing & Celebrating the Seven Essential Characteristics found in a Vital Parish



Our seven-week series in preparation for our Parish Assembly on Thursday, November 6<sup>th</sup>, begins this weekend. A member of our Pastor Council will speak at every Mass after Communion this weekend on Community.

Community is an essential element of parish life which draws parishioners together in mutual support, activity, celebration, and growth. It is the unity that results when members become involved with one another in all other elements of the pastoral mission. By joining together in work and worship, evangelization efforts, service to others, stewardship of God's gifts, and shared leadership, members of the parish form a community where life is shared and nurtured. This development of community is an ongoing process, ever evolving, changing, and responding in new ways in the promptings of the Spirit

Next weekend at all the Masses there will be a presentation on the essential element of Worship.

### COMMUNITY

*Community* is an essential element of parish life which draws parishioners together in mutual support, activity, celebration, and growth. It is the unity that results when members become involved with one another in all other elements of the pastoral mission.

By joining together in work and worship, evangelization efforts, service to others, stewardship of God's gifts, and shared leadership, members of the parish form a community where life is shared and nurtured. This development is an ongoing process, ever evolving, changing, and responding in new ways in the prompting of the Spirit.

A parish is a place where everyone belongs. Inclusivity and mutuality are hallmarks of community. Special efforts to include those who are physically and mentally challenged or those who are otherwise neglected serve to connect a parish to the broader human community.

Consistent with these basic expectations is that each parish:

- 1) provide pastoral care for families through initiatives of welcome and outreach, programs for parenting, ministry to the divorced and separated, ministry to persons in troubled marriages and families, to bereaved persons, etc.
- 2) bring about a sense of belonging and an atmosphere of hospitality within the parish, e.g. greeting/welcoming visitors/new parishioners.
- 3) provide regular and effective communication services with parishioners, such as a Sunday bulletin parish information packets, parish newsletters and parish/cluster web site.
- 4) actively work towards the convalidation of marriages and provide pastorally tactful and sensitive contacts with cohabiting couples to assist them in their situation and faith.
- 5) provide effective and ongoing ministry to bereaved persons
- 6) provide regular and effective ministry to persons who are elderly, sick or homebound.
- 7) provide, if possible, some form of child care, as well as a Children's Liturgy of the Word, during at least some Sunday Masses.

### Reflection & Prayer

In light of the above, ask yourself the following questions, give thought and prayer to your reflection.

As a Catholic and as a parishioner of Saint Anselm Church, is Community – an important part of my life? Does the Community of St. Anselm strengthen and support me as I try to live a Catholic lifestyle? Are there ways that I can build up, strengthen, and support the faith community of Saint Anselm?

### Collection for Black and Indian Missions

Next weekend, there will also be a collection for the Missions in our country which serve Black and Native American Peoples. Many of these Missions were begun by Mother Katharine Drexel. This collection also benefits a number of parishes and programs within the Archdiocese of Philadelphia.

### Tuition Assistance

There are a few families in our parish who could use some assistance in paying their tuition to Saint Anselm School. Low income, unemployment or sickness has caused the need. If anyone is able and willing to help, please contact me.

### School Security & Entrance to School Building

The world in which we live has caused the implementation of many security and safety precautions. All schools, including Saint Anselm School, are concerned about the safety of students, teachers and others in the school building. All in the school need to be protected from violent and angry persons and, at times, from non-custodial parents.

All visitors to Saint Anselm School are to enter the school building via the outside door to the main office. This door is on the schoolyard side of the school and it is accessible from the parking lot behind the school.

Visitors mean everyone – parents, lunch mothers, volunteers, sales persons, and people in parish organizations who have school business.

People coming to purchase Scrip are to enter the Scrip room, which also has a door accessible from the back parking lot.

All visitors must sign in and out. In the event of a fire or fire drill, the secretary needs to take this book with her as she exits a building just as a teacher takes her roll book so the school can check that all have made it safely out of the building.

Please do not try to enter the school through the Church or the Parish Center.

Please cooperate with this. Thank you.

### 10 Miles per Hour in the Parking Lot

The beginning of a new school year is a good time for us to remind all drivers to drive slowly in the parking lot. During school hours and even after school hours, children are in the parking lot which is also a school yard for recreational activities.

### Parking – School Hours

During school hours, please do not park in the parking lot area nearest the school. This part of the parking lot boarded by the Church and school will be used for school recess and for the after school CARES program. Also, should there be an emergency, no parking in this area will give free

access to the school building for emergency response vehicles such as fire engines and ambulances.

There is plenty of parking back by the garage and fence.
