## **Happy First Sunday of Lent:**

Didn't we just take down the manger scene? Were not the Christmas decorations just put away? The answer to both of these questions is: "Yes!" How quickly time moves along, especially with the Catholic Church calendar. Ash Wednesday, too, has now passed and here we are in our 2016 Lenten Season.

There are many ways in which we can compare and speak about the Season of Lent. For me, with this being the first Lent that I will celebrate with you as your Pastor, I think I can accomplish this task in a two-fold way.

First, let me mention that this past Saturday I witnessed, and participated in, the "19154 5K." What a whirlwind of a day and events that transpired on our Church grounds and Parish that brisk Saturday morning. Many thanks to Father Friel, and his wonderful staff for all the preparations that went into setting up the race and all its venues. As a participant in the activities and the "5K," let me share my experiences.

On the days and weeks leading up to the 5K, Fr. Friel's office in the Parish Center was abuzz with activity. Signs and all assorted "stuff" found their way to his room. Saturday mornings, leading up to the race, were used for folks trying to get in shape for the race, through the directions of a doctor/trainer. I saw this first hand as I was setting up my "PA system" for the upcoming CYO basketball games.

On Friday afternoon before the 5K, I walked over to Our Lady of Victory Hall. As I entered, there were so many folks busy about many things. The getting ready of the shirts and bags for the runners was in full swing. I received my bag, as well as one for my nephew. Saturday morning, February 6, showed just how awesome Saint Anselm Parish is. From early in the morning, the many staff and volunteers for the race were setting up all the necessary spots for the race on and off of our property.

First, there was the "One Mile Fun Run" for our younger grade school aged children. Then the "One Mile Walk." On Saturday afternoon, I wished I had signed up for that one.☺ And then the 5K. As we all stood at the base of Dunks Ferry Place, there were all sorts of people there: different ages, genders, heights, and....As the race began, we journeyed down Dunks Ferry Road and saw how the course wound its way through our great Parish. Along the way, there were the Philadelphia Police who were leading us. Along the way, there were staff members with "arrow signs" to point us in the right direction. Along the way, there were folks encouraging the runner from the street and from the steps and doors of their homes. And then, mercifully for me, 36 minutes and 22 seconds later, was the "Finish Line!" And then, over to Our Lady of Victory Hall for refreshments and closing ceremonies. What a wonderful experience for all!

To compare our Lenten Season with the above "19154 5K" is not too difficult. We should be prepared, every year, for the Lenten Season. We know the "signs" that Lent is approaching. We have our spiritual "doctor/ trainer with our weekday and Sunday readings from Scripture. We have our "spiritual bag" with all the things that we need for Lent: Ashes, Corporal and Spiritual Works of Mercy, the Ten Commandments, the Sacrament of Reconciliation. We started Lent on Dunks Ferry Road. Our Lenten Journey will take us to many places of business, to schools, to neighborhoods, to shopping places, and to family and friends. There are "arrows," basically our consciences, that will show us the ways that we need to go. And our "finish line" will be the Easter Triduum, with Holy Thursday, Good Friday, and Holy Saturday. Our walk to Our Lady of Victory Hall for refreshment and "closing ceremonies" will be Easter Sunday. If you participated fully in the Lenten Season this year with all the preparation and enthusiasm of our "19154 5K," what joy you will receive as you celebrate the Lord's Resurrection with all of our Lenten participants and parishioners on Easter morning!

Have a wonderful and prayerful Lenten Season. God bless you.

+ *FASTING* +

Fasting and external penitential practices are accompanied by an inner attitude of conversion. One goes without food and applies physical discipline to “chastise one’s own soul” (Lev. 16:31), to humble oneself before God (Dan. 9:3) and/or to prepare oneself for an encounter with God.

The Church urges all Catholics to voluntarily choose acts of penance on all days of Lent. The minimal obligations are:

Ash Wednesday & Good Friday:	days of fast and abstinence
Fridays in Lent:	days of abstinence

**Fasting:** all Catholics over 18 years and under 59 years.

**Abstinence:** all over 14 years

Fasting, an ancient practice common to all world religions is a proven way to awaken the spiritual senses in a body dulled by satisfaction. Voluntary fasting, even for short periods, reminds us that hunger is not an idea but a visceral assault on our most basic human instinct to survive. Wealth, it has been said, “is the power to eat” whenever and whatever you wish. Fasting interrupts this security momentarily and brings us into solidarity with those millions who fast involuntarily in a world where feast and famine are neighbors, often in the same city. Fasting reminds the strong that hunger and poverty are the worst forms of violence against the weak, an insult to human dignity and an affront to basic fairness in our world.

For Christians, a real Lenten fast this year is a chance to recover spiritual resources that have lain fallow and unused. Prayer and fasting are good for the body and soul, and offer a chance to recapture the meaning of Jesus’ words, “*Blessed are those who hunger and thirst for justice, for they will be satisfied*”.

+ *ALMSGIVING (Works of Charity)* +

*To sacrifice – to do without so that others may have – is the spirit at the core of Christian sacrifice. Jesus sacrificed his life that we might have the fullness of life. The poor or people in need could use those extra coins or dollars that are saved because of a light meal or candy-less day or tobacco-free or alcohol-free Lent. Poor boxes are located at the entrances inside the Church. Monies received in the Poor Box are used by our Saint Vincent de Paul Society which responds to the needs of people in our community.*

**Lenten Coin Folder:** Monies saved through Lenten sacrifice may be placed in the Lenten Coin Folders or **Miter Boxes** Boxes. This money will benefit Saint Anselm School. Parishioners are asked to designate their Lenten sacrifice monies to our school.

**Poor Boxes:** Monies received in the Poor Box are used by our Saint Vincent DePaul Society which responds to the needs of the people in our community.

**Catholic Charities Appeal:** Your generous, sacrificial gift to the 2016 Catholic Charities Appeal will support the Catholic Church’s commitment to the poor, needy, and vulnerable in our midst.

# *Saint Anselm SCRIP Program*

## *What is SCRIP?*

Participation in the SCRIP Program helps families pay tuition for Catholic education. This includes Grade Schools, High Schools and Colleges and CCD.

Gift cards are purchased in the SCRIP Office. A percentage of the purchase is credited toward the school of your choice. For those who do not have a child in Catholic School or CCD, the credit would then go to St. Anselm Parish or you may direct it to another family.

**Example:** Purchase food certificates  
 $\$100.00 \times 52 \text{ weeks} = \$5,200.00 \times 4\% \text{ tuition reimbursement} = \$208.00 \text{ per year.}$
