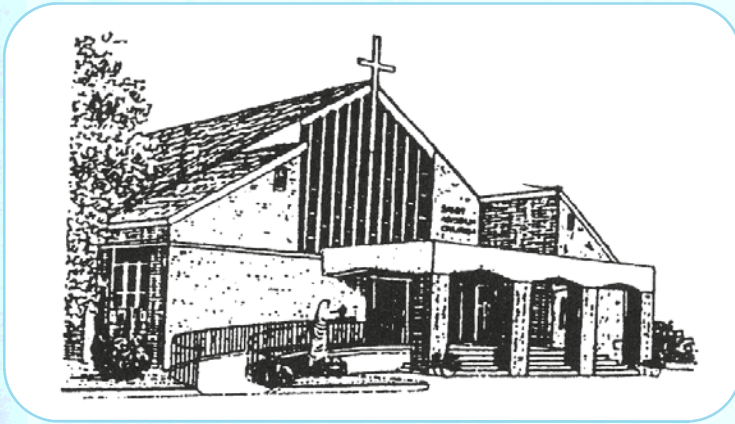

This week we are celebrating Catholic Schools Week. Many activities were planned as well as the annual Catholic Schools Week Liturgy. More to follow in next week’s Bulletin as to all of the activities that took place this week in our awesome school. Speaking of our awesome school, I want to thank our Student Council representatives who spoke at all of our Masses on Sunday, January 31. We are moving ahead with our School Development Committee. As I previously stated, the committee met for the first time two weeks ago. We are planning to meet again this Thursday, February 4. To use a quote from ‘America Magazine,’ used by Archbishop Chaput in a recent article from Philly.com: “It is time to recover and promote our schools for the 21st century. The current hospice mentality—watching our schools slowly die—must give way to a renewed confidence.” It is to such an end that our Parish Development Committee is working toward. Remember, the idea of this committee took shape at the Parish Assemblies held last year. We ALL have a vested interest in our St. Anselm School and students: past, current, and future!

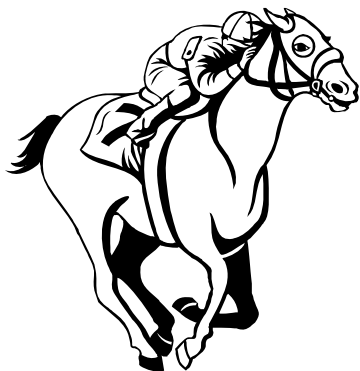
