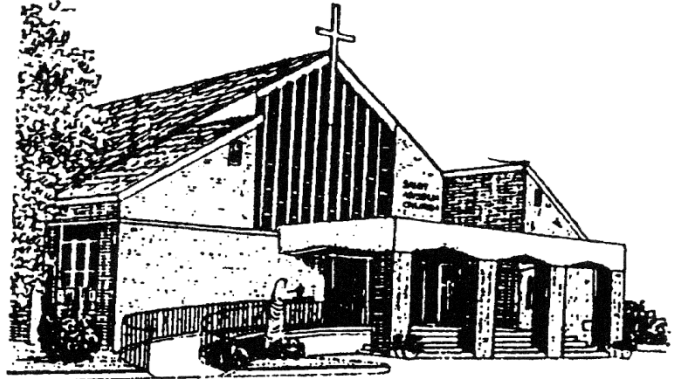

BAPTISMS

Baptisms are every Sunday at 1:00 PM. Parents are asked to call the Parish Center and speak with the Priest or Deacon who is on call and who will assist them in registering their child for Baptism. The Church assists the parents by offering instruction on the meaning, importance, and responsibilities of the sacrament of Baptism. A Pre-Jordan Baptismal Program for helping parents prepare for the spiritual birth of their child is held on the fourth Sunday of most months in the Spirituality Center following the Noon Mass.

Dear Parishioners,

Hopefully, the very hot weather of this summer is finding you with ways to beat the heat. If we think the temperatures are hot here, imagine how hot it will be in the place where we would go if we do not keep the commandments.

The Gospel reading this past week talked about Jesus and His disciples trying to find an out-of-the way place to be alone for awhile and refresh themselves.

As I was growing up, I remember going with my father to a number of places. No matter where we went, it always seemed that he knew somebody there. If we were at a Phillies game, visiting downtown Philadelphia, traveling on the Frankford El or the subway, at one time or another, someone would recognize my dad and, vice versa. There was no place that we would go without me being introduced to one of my dad's many friends. My nieces and nephews now tell me the same thing about myself. I can't go anywhere, especially as priest, where I don't meet someone from my ministries and assignments.

For instance, many years ago I was taking my mom to the foot doctor. A monthly trip that we had down "to a science." However, on this particular day, the street outside of the doctor's office was being resurfaced. We took care of the appointment and, as we were leaving, the workers were outside of the office door. I led my mother carefully around the workers and their equipment. As we walked just a few yards from the scene, all of a sudden I heard one of the workers shout: "Fr. Chiriaco!" Surprised, I turned around, and recognized the voice and the face of the worker. I said "Whittle—third seat first aisle." The young man was a student in one of my classes at West Catholic. My mom said: "You're just like your father." It was a chance meeting; however, one that did both of us good.

It reminds me of the many times and ways that the Lord "calls our name." We can never be far from the Lord. At times, we may try—for one reason or another. The key propositions here are: "FROM" and "WITH." As we move through our daily lives, let us never be far FROM the Lord; never let us be constantly moving FROM the Lord. Rather, let us walk WITH the Lord. Let us recognize His voice in the noise of our daily lives.

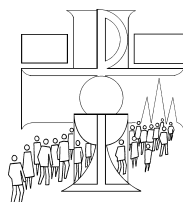
Like my dad, no matter where we go, we should always recognize someone. And that someone should always be the Lord. Stay cool!

Information on Clearances required by School & Parish Volunteers

As part of our Catholic commitment to safe environments, the Archdiocese recently updated its policies and training curriculum for mandated reporters of child abuse and neglect. If you have minimal contact with children, such as trip chaperones and event volunteers such as the Oktoberfest, Christmas Bazaar, Race for Education, Carnival, etc., you are required to provide the following clearances:

- **Criminal Record Check**
- **Child Abuse Clearance**
- **Signed Mandated Reporter Acknowledgement Form (available at the Parish Center)**
- **Signed FBI Disclosure Statement if you have continuously lived in the State of Pennsylvania for ten years (available at the Parish Center); otherwise, an FBI Fingerprint Clearance is required (contact the Parish Center for additional information).**

Persons with regular contact with children, including classroom volunteers, CYO coaches, most parish/school organization board members and committee chairpersons are required to provide the following:

- **Criminal Record Check**
- **Child Abuse Clearance**
- **Signed Mandated Reporter Acknowledgement Form (available at the Parish Center)**
- **Signed FBI Disclosure Statement if you have continuously lived in the State of Pennsylvania for ten years (available at the Parish Center); otherwise, an FBI Fingerprint Clearance is required (contact the Parish Center for additional information).**
- **Safe Environment Program (class attendance necessary)**
- **Mandated Reporter Training (on-line program)**

The FBI Disclosure Statement is now available at the front desk of the Parish Center for volunteers who have completed all other requirements. Please stop at your convenience to complete the form.

Clearances are now valid for three years only. Individuals whose clearances are older than three years, were not previously required, or will expire, must be in compliance by October 31, 2015.
