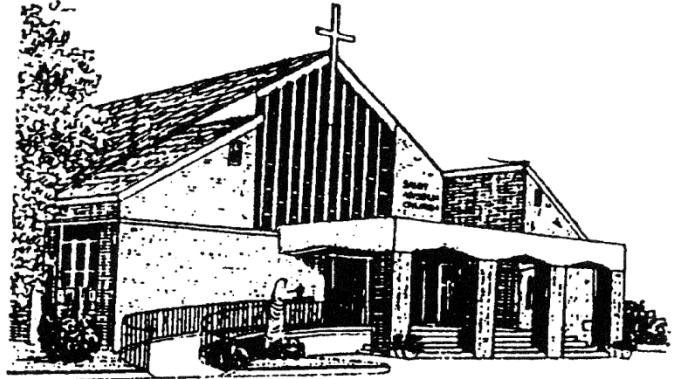

## BAPTISMS

Baptisms are every Sunday at 1:00 PM. Parents are asked to call the Parish Center and speak with the Priest or Deacon who is on call and who will assist them in registering their child for Baptism. The Church assists the parents by offering instruction on the meaning, importance, and responsibilities of the sacrament of Baptism. A Pre-Jordan Baptismal Program for helping parents prepare for the spiritual birth of their child is held on the fourth Sunday of most months in the Spirituality Center following the Noon Mass.

Dear Parishioners,

I hope all is well with you and your family as we move into the month of August. Where is the summer going? Of course, both parents and students are asking this question for different reasons.

Every once in a while, doesn't life seem to get a bit too complicated. We can be sailing along, with our lives being quite predictable and then, all of a sudden, we are hit with something unexpected. It can be something financial, work related, family issues, emotional, physical, or medical that turns our lives upside down.

When I was growing up I remember a man named Mr. Cote who lived in our neighborhood. Mr. Cote had a light green and white Chevrolet Biscayne. He kept it spotless for many, many years. In his retirement, Mr. Cote could be seen in the alley, either washing his car or, most times, tinkering with the engine. The hood of the car was always up. You could walk by and Mr. Cote couldn't wait to show some part of the shiny engine that he maintained in his Chevy. Back then, the engines basically sat in the middle, under the hood. There was plenty of room in the front of the radiator and on the sides of the engine compartment with all of the vital engine parts visible. However, eventually, his pride and joy "ran out of gas."

In 1978, Mr. Cote was forced to buy a new car. I believe it was a Chevrolet Chevette. As I walked up the alley one Saturday morning, Mr. Cote was in his garage with his new car outside. And, the hood was not up. I went into the garage to ask Mr. Cote how he liked his new car. He looked at me, and began to cry. This car was nothing like his old, predictable one. And when he lifted up the hood, the engine had changed on him. As with the new, modern engines-even back then-there were more hoses and wires, and everything compacted into a very restricted area. No longer did Mr. Cote feel comfortable enough to tinker with the engine. It was not the same for him.

At times, life becomes for us like Mr. Cote's two cars. We can be very comfortable with our lives, walking along with Our Lord. And then.....Let us pray to the Lord for those "and then" moments. Let us ask the Lord for his courage and guidance when the simplicity of our "engines" change into situations that are more complicated. Situations in life may change but the love and patience that the Lord has for us is always consistent. We always need to remember that.

As our new school year approaches, let us all continue to speak proudly of our school and parish. Let everyone in the area see what a great parish St. Anselm continues to be.
