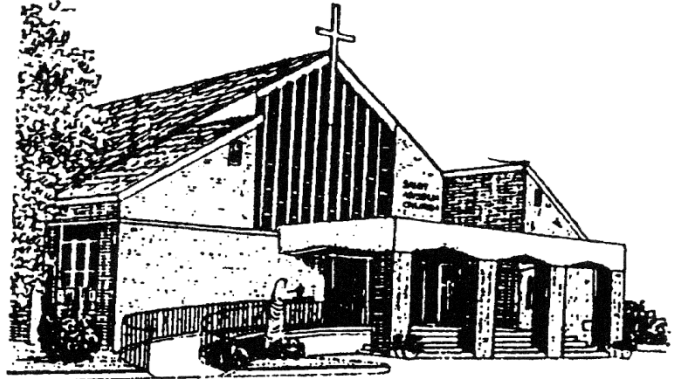

BAPTISMS

Baptisms are every Sunday at 1:00 PM. Parents are asked to call the Parish Center and speak with the Priest or Deacon who is on call and who will assist them in registering their child for Baptism. The Church assists the parents by offering instruction on the meaning, importance, and responsibilities of the sacrament of Baptism. A Pre-Jordan Baptismal Program for helping parents prepare for the spiritual birth of their child is held on the fourth Sunday of most months in the Spirituality Center following the Noon Mass.

On September 14, Bill was installed as a Lector, one of the steps leading to his ordination as a Permanent Deacon. And, a thank you for all of our parishioners who are so generous in contributing to our tuition assistance program. Truly, we all support each other in making our parish run each and every day, in each and every way.
