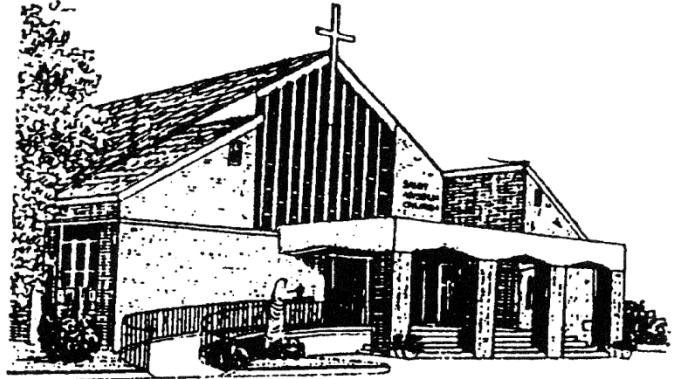

BAPTISMS

Baptisms are every Sunday at 1:00 PM. Parents are asked to call the Parish Center and speak with the Priest or Deacon who is on call and who will assist them in registering their child for Baptism. The Church assists the parents by offering instruction on the meaning, importance, and responsibilities of the sacrament of Baptism. A Pre-Jordan Baptismal Program for helping parents prepare for the spiritual birth of their child is held on the fourth Sunday of most months in the Spirituality Center following the Noon Mass.

Never seeing the “towers,” I thought that the building was never constructed. Little did I ever think that one day, I would be the pastor of “Teller Towers!”

A salute to Msgr. Teller and to all the wonderful pastors and priests that have graced St. Anselm Parish over the years. Also, this past weekend, the Sisters, Servants of the Immaculate Heart of Mary were here for the annual chance drive. A well-deserved salute to the sisters who graced our parish and school.
